

SRO Talking Points

- Not enough data for the district to extend the contract for another year
- Remove SROs completely from Middle Schools
- The survey company the CRCSD used, Panorama, messed up
 - Challenge looking at the data through the impact SROs had on Black students and students of color vs. white students
- A tremendous reduction in arrests when removing some SROs
 - Over 220 students charged in 18-19 to around 40 charged in 21-22 in High School
- Reducing the number of SROs in the district would save money, which schools could use for mental health services
 - Mental Health Supports: Shows 524 students who weren't able to access services
- Eliminate the two floaters (allegedly, they spent significant time at the two most diverse high schools where there is already another full-time SRO)
 - Replace with therapists and restorative facilitators
 - Could have multiple therapists/restorative facilitators in place of the cost for one SRO
- No data suggests that SROs prevent or deter school shootings
- Major disproportionality at the middle school when reviewing this year's arrest data; similar to the years past
- Extend the contract only three months to get better data from students on how they feel about SROs at the beginning of the school year
